Author Diana Butler Bass once read a poem by Wendell Berry entitled "Manifesto", in which the closing line encourages readers to "Practice resurrection". These words stopped her and she pondered them for years. She writes:

"When I first read those words, they puzzled me. What does it mean to 'practice resurrection'? Over the years, however, the phrase remained in my mind, making far more sense to me now than it ince did. It is a call to live an Easter life—to attend to birthing life from death, to pay attention to what is rising around us. Practicing resurrection is a midwifing, nurturing, healing, and boundary-breaking thing to do. If we can practice resurrection, turning that seemingly impossible Easter event into a way of life, might it be possible to practice the cross? I do wonder: what did Jesus have in mind when he directed people to 'take up your cross and follow me?'"

What would that look like if we practiced the cross?

Practicing the cross sounds hard, and in some ways it is, but it is also joyful and the road to new life.


