Lessons from Lightning Bugs

Today I am getting ready to leave to go to a spiritual retreat in Colorado. During this retreat we will be studying a book called "Sacred Earth, Sacred Soul" by John Phillip Newell. If you would like to follow along with me, I highly recommend this book! I also think you will probably hear more about what I learned there upon my return.

As I was preparing to leave for the retreat, I found myself thinking about another retreat I attended in June--13 years ago-- in Harlan Iowa. That time in Iowa was quite sacred and special to me. When I came back, I wrote the following for the July Potwin Post. I decided that it was a good time to re-run it for this year.

The cottonwood trees at the retreat center called me out into the dark night with the rustling of their leaves. It was then I wrote the following in my journal.

"The giant row of trees stood as they have for a century, each with waists nearly a yard in circumference. Between the trees I could look out into the dark sea of soybeans in the field next door. But the most amazing thing I saw on this cool summer night in Iowa was the lightening bugs. Everywhere you looked, on every surface and in the air, were lightening bugs--millions of points of light. It was like walking through a sky full of moving twinkling stars. The soybean sea and the sky full of sparkling bugs seemed to stretch off into infinity.

And so I sat in their midst and pondered the lowly lightening bug.

News from Doorstep

Each little bug carries within itself its own energy, its own light, a spark from and of the Great Creator. What fun God must have had designing these creatures! Each insect, barely more than an inch long, contains enough bioluminescence to be seen for long distances. Together, they make a light show that rivals 4th of July fireworks.

We are like these illuminated insects. We are carriers of the spark of God. Alone we can be a point of light in the Great Dark. Together, we can be so much more, all to the Glory of God.

Go and be a little lightening bug in a dark world. Together we can make it shine.

NEWS FROM DOORSTEP

This month we begin our 58th year of neighbors helping neighbors! Thank you to everyone who bought quilt tickets, took sporting equipment to Play It Again Sports, or attended our Annual Banquet. These three events brought in \$2,276 combined. Congratulations to our Volunteer of the Year Award Winners: Jackie, Mitchell, Julia, Brenda, Sharon, and Shirley! We truly could not function without the assistance of all our volunteers!

The need for food assistance has remained high so far this year. In the first 4 months of 2024, we provided 51,370 pounds of food in 918 food orders feeding 2,303 individuals.

The Doorstep Executive Committee has begun work with Coneflower Consulting on a new Strategic Plan. Our current plan, which has been worked on and revised over the past several years, is nearly complete; and it is time to begin looking forward to where we want Doorstep to be in the future. As part of this process, we will have surveys for people to complete online and provide feedback to show trends on what people think are our strengths / weaknesses in our services, as an agency, and more. We want as many people as possible to complete the surveys to provide us with feedback from our community, congregations, donors, volunteers, clients, etc. As we begin our strategic planning retreats to do the work required in crafting our new plan, we want and need to know what people think.


