Homegrown Evangelist

(Last Sunday) Caitlyn brought 2 people to church with her. One was a friend from work, the other was a stranger she met in a coffee shop. Somehow, they got into a conversation about church, and Caitlyn told him about our church, and how we follow Christ, and then she invited him to join us. She must have shown him a light he wanted to see for himself!

That my friends, is how you lead people to our building, and more importantly, that is how you lead people to Christ. This is evangelism at its finest---and from one who was raised among us. This is an example we all can follow! We can all be evangelists.

Evangelism is a word that has gotten very negative press as of late. This word can be associated with what I call "Cram it down your throat" Christianity. Because of this association, many avoid the e-thing like the plague. But if we look at the true meaning of the word, we see a very different picture painted.

The common Greek word used for evangelism in the Scriptures originally meant "messenger." Later the meaning morphed to "sharing the gospel," or "sharing the good news." This word has also been associated with the word "Angel" which means "Messenger of God". That doesn't sound so bad does it?

So, if we take all of these definitions and roll them together, we get "being God's Messenger by sharing the good news."

Author Martha Grace Reese points out in her book, "Unbinding the Gospel: Real Life Evangelism" that is also helpful to look at what evangelism is not. She states that evangelism...

"Isn't about talking people into beliefs. It isn't about scaring them with horror stories of Hell fire and damnation. There are no quick fixes or silver bullets. At

its core, evangelism is people sharing with others their personal understandings that life is better, richer, truer if one has faith in Jesus Christ and lives in a faith community."

Reese further defines evangelism as:

"Anything you do to help another person move closer to a relationship with God or into Christian community."

And isn't that exactly what Caitlyn did last Sunday morning? She invited a friend and a stranger to come with her, to move closer to God and perhaps find Christian community here with us a Potwin Church? It seems to me we have raised her well! Remember that Proverbs 22:6 says, "Train up a child in the way she should go, and when she is grown she will not depart from it."

If Caitlyn can do that, can you? Consider this a challenge!



REMEMBERING OUR HISTORY Submitted by Linda Tuller

The Rev. Irwin W. Johnson served as Potwin's pastor from 1940 until 1944. On Wednesday morning, June 5, there was a message on our answering machine. A man's voice said "we are in Columbia, Missouri and headed to Topeka in about 2 hours. My father was pastor there in the 1940's and we would like to visit the church later today". As I am typically in the office on Wednesday mornings, I listened to the message, returned the call, and agreed to meet that afternoon. Roger Johnson, 85 years old, met me with his daughter, Kay. Roger's father, Rev Johnson, came to Potwin, when Roger was just one year old and 5 when they left to serve a church in Childress, Texas. Over the ensuing years, they moved every 4 or 5 years to another city and church.

As we sat in the sanctuary, Roger only remembered sitting in the balcony with his mother, juggling him and his brother Stanley, 3 years older. I explained the building changes Potwin has experienced over these years. When I asked if he was still a Presbyterian, he shared that he is a Cumberland Presbyterian, as he has lived in Mckenzie, Tennessee for close to 50 years. Since 1963, he has been a psychics professor at Bethel University. Roger was very surprised to learn that Potwin was originally a "Cumberland" church. We had a great discussion about our shared history and the changes in both denominations. The Cumberland church is still centered mostly in the Appalachia area of our country and currently has about 80,000 members.

Our tour of the building reminded me that the building is now in the same configuration as it was when Rev Johnson was here. I explained our loss of space caused by the recent sale and noted the same accessibility issues that were there in the 1940's remain.

Roger said he'd lived in 12 states while growing up as a "preacher's kid". The family was in Garden City, Kansas when he was in High School and he graduated from Garden City High School. His brother Stanley, worked for the highway department while they were there and was killed while working on a highway crew. The Kansas Department of Transportation had recently notified him of a memorial to highway workers who had died on the job. He and Kay were on their way to this memorial, located at the Paxico rest area on Interstate 70.

As he was so young when he lived in Topeka, Roger did not know about the Potwin community. But he did remember that his family had lived in the manse, then located at 418 Elmwood. Before they left, I took them on a tour of the neighborhood, showing them the "circle streets" and talking about the historical homes. We then stopped in front of 418 Elmwood, where we sat for a long time. I could see Roger pulling back memories of his time there. Finally he said, "the house was 2-story. In the upper floor bathroom was a door that you could open to drop clothing". I said "Yes, a laundry chute!". Roger replied, "I remember climbing up and dropping down!" What a neat childhood memory!






BLESSING BOX & LITTLE LIBRARY
