PEACE

Our Loose Coin Offering for October will go to the Peacemaking and Global Witness Offering of the PCUSA. Our gift to the Peace & Global Witness Offering enables the denominational church to promote the Peace of Christ by addressing systems of injustice across the world. Once again we see that we can do more together than we can alone. 25% of what we take in for this offering stays with us to use in our local peacemaking efforts. Last week the Session authorized the creation of a new Mission Partner for the Church—The Topeka Center for Peace and Justice—and they designated this agency to be the recipient of our 25% of the offering.

"In December of 1985, The Topeka Peace Resource Center (name changed in 1992) opened its doors to carry out its mission to promote and educate the community on peace and justice issues and establish the Peace and Justice Library. It has been a place that welcomes an exchange of ideas, information, and encouragement to propel people of all faiths and walks of life down the path of peace. The center was designed to be a clearing house for peace-related activities.

The Topeka Center of Peace and Justice is currently working to bring restorative justice practices to elementary and middle schools in this area. They work directly with the district attorney's office to offer victim/offender mediation services to juveniles, Shawnee County and Court Services. This gives the youth the opportunity to learn from mistakes and hear from those who are affected by these mistakes and provides an opportunity to move forward as part of the community rather than becoming repeat offenders. They work with the University of Kansas to offer Parent/Youth Facilitation



NEWS FROM DOORSTEP



Our neighbors are really struggling to make ends meet this year. From 2023 to 2024 the number of food orders we have provided in 8 months has increased by 34%! Keeping food on our shelves has been a challenge again this year! Doorstep has already spent over \$43,000 on food purchases through August, and we have been buying food nearly every 2 months. The statistics below show the real need of our neighbors, and Doorstep as we try to provide a full food order each time. Our neighbors are already struggling to make ends meet, keeping their rent and utilities

paid, and dealing with the crisis that life throws at them... having money to keep food on the table and personal hygiene items continues to be a challenge. In the first eight months of 2024, we have spent over \$200k on rent, utilities, dental vouchers, prescriptions, Topeka Metro passes, gas vouchers, hygiene products, auto services, and more.


